RESOLUTION OF THE COOK COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Cook County Board of Health to adopt the rules and regulations mandated by the State of Georgia for on-site sewage management systems, food service establishments, tourist accommodations, and portable sanitation.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Rules and Regulations for On-Site Sewage Management Systems, referenced as O.C.G.A. 511-3-1, as subsequently amended and updated, are hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulation will be identified as Cook County Board of Health Rule III.
- 2. The Rules and Regulations for Food Service, referenced as O.C.G.A. 511-6-1, as subsequently amended and updated, are hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulations will be identified as Cook County Board of Health Rule V.
- 3. The Rules and Regulations for Tourist Accommodations, referenced as O.C.G.A. 511-6-2, as subsequently amended and updated, is hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulations will be identified as Cook County Board of Health Rule VII.
- 4. The Rules and Regulations for Portable Sanitation, referenced as O.C.G.A. 511-3-6, as subsequently amended and updated, is hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulations will be identified as Cook County Board of Health Rule IX.
- 5. The existing Cook County Board of Health Rules and Regulations for On-Site Sewage Management Systems (the existing lot sizes shall remain in effect- pages M-1 and M-2), Food Service, and Tourist Accommodations are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, it is also the desire of the Cook County Board of Health to adopt rules and regulations pertaining to Rabies Control and the construction and/or operation of Public Swimming Pools, Spas, and Recreational Water Parks.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The rules and regulations pertaining to Rabies Control are hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulations will be identified as Cook Board of Health Rule II.
- 2. The rules and regulations pertaining to Public Swimming Pools, Spas, and Recreational Water Parks are hereby adopted and given full force and effect as regulations of the Cook County Board of Health. The regulations will be identified as Cook County Board of Health Rule VI.
- 3. The existing Cook County Board of Health Rules and Regulations for Rabies Control and for Public Swimming Pools, Spas, and Natural Beaches are hereby repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE.

The effective date of the new rules and regulations will be thirty (30) days after the adoption date.

This fee includes all routine compliance inspections for one year. This fee will include the permit for one facility and the one artist/operator. Additional artist permits will be \$100 per year for each additional artist.

Miscellaneous

\$15 per 15 mins

This fee includes other environmental services and will be charged in increments of 15 minutes.

Exclusions

Certain governmental facilities, governmental sponsored facilities, public schools, and other applicable facilities to be determined by the District Health Director. Additionally, the District Health Director reserves the authority to waive any environmental health fee he/she deems necessary.

Cook County Board of Health

Under the authority of the Official Code of Georgia annotate, Title 31, Chapter 3 (GA Code 31-3-4) 2016, the Board of Health hereby establishes updated Environmental Health fees (see attached fee schedule).

All money collected shall be handled in accordance with acceptable accounting procedures and deposited in the Board of Health general fund account of this county and used in accordance with Georgia Law.

The effective date of this fee schedule shall be thirty (30) days after the approval by the Cook County Board of Commissioners.

ORDINANCE FOR ENFORCEMENT OF COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ENACTING A CODE OF ENFORCEMENT OF RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COOK COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH; EXPRESS ADOPTION OF APPLICABLE RULES AND REGULATIONS; DELEGATION OF DUTIES OF IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT TO THE COOK COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH; PROVISION FOR CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR PROVISION OF PROCEDURAL RIGHTS; ESTABLISHMENT OF JURISDICTION OF MAGISTRATE'S COURT OVER VIOLATORS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

ALL FOR THE PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE PEOPLE OF COOK COUNTY, GEORGIA.

I.

There are currently in existence certain rules and regulations adopted by the Cook County Board of Health with the purpose of preserving the public health, safety, and welfare of citizens of Cook County, Georgia. This ordinance specifically incorporates by reference the provision of the following rules and regulations which are in force at the time of adoption of this ordinance and as amended:

- A. Rules and Regulations pertaining to Rabies Control (adopted by the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule II as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Rabies Control;
- B. Rules and Regulations for On-Site Sewage Management Systems (adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health, as O.C.G.A. Chapter 511-3-1 and the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule III as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to On-Site Sewage Management Systems;
- C. Rules and Regulations pertaining to On-Site Water Supplies (adopted by the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule IV as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to On-Site Water Supplies;

- D. Rules and Regulations for Food Service (adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health, as O.C.G.A. Chapter 511-6-1 and the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule V as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Food Service;
- E. Rules and Regulations pertaining to Public Swimming Pools, Spas, and Recreational Water Parks (adopted by the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule VI as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Public Swimming Pools, Spas, and Recreational Water Parks;
- F. Rules and Regulations for Tourist Accommodations (adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health, as O.C.G.A. Chapter 511-6-2 and the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule VII as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Tourist Accommodations;
- G. Rules and Regulations pertaining to Body Art (adopted by the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule VIII as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Body Art;
- H. Rules and Regulations for Portable Sanitation (adopted by the Georgia Department of Public Health, as O.C.G.A. Chapter 511-3-6 and the Cook County Board of Health and being Cook County Board of Health Rule IX as subsequently amended and updated), and policies of the Cook County Board of Health pertaining to Portable Sanitation; and

II.

The duty of implementation and enforcement of these regulations rest with the Cook County Board of Commissioners and by virtue of this ordinance is hereby expressly delegated to the Cook Board of Health who is hereby charged with promulgation of sufficient procedures for insuring compliance with these rules and regulations by the citizens of Cook County. The Cook County Board of Health is directed to implement procedures which will ensure that the citizens of Cook County will receive all procedural rights to which they are entitled under the laws of the State of Georgia.

Any violation of the rules and regulations hereby referenced shall be a violation of this ordinance and shall be a misdemeanor offense. Any violator shall be subject to the imposition of a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and/or imprisonment for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days. Any failure of payment of inspection fees listed within the fee schedule adopted by the Cook County Board of Health and approved by the Cook County Board of Commissioners within sixty (60) days of first notice, may result in suspension of permit.

IV.

The magistrate's court of Cook County shall have jurisdiction over violators of this ordinance and all procedures for enforcement of such ordinance shall be as provided in Article 4, Chapter 10 of Title 15, Official Code of Georgia. Complaints of violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be brought before the magistrate's court by a designated representative of the Cook Board of Health and shall be prosecuted through that court.
